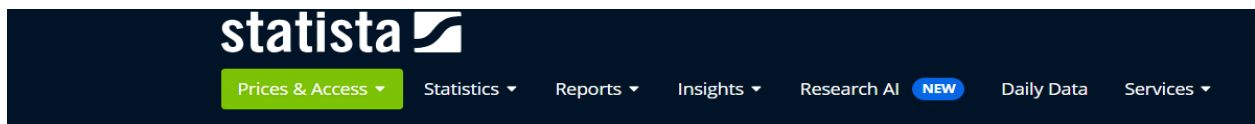

According to the table, the plan for admitting students with limited income follows a specialized mechanism for classifying them into different categories. Based on these classifications, students are granted tuition discounts ranging from 5% to 100%, with some receiving full exemptions. These discounts are applied across all targeted departments, offering financial relief to eligible students. This structured approach is supported by statistical data provided by Administrative Affairs, ensuring that students from various income levels benefit from reduced tuition fees.
